The President's Message

On-Scene at Everhart's Turkey Clinic

On April 2nd I took up an offer from one of the programs KC-SCI sponsored with your hard earned Hunter's Expo dollars. Long time friends of our chapter Johnny & Linda Everhart and many volunteers annually put on a Youth Turkey Hunting Clinic on his ranch near Clinton, MO. Open to our youth as well as the public, attendance is limited to 40 young people and is always a sell out, so to speak, since the kids attend free of charge. Along with Missouri Department of Conservation, Everhart's Sporting Goods of Clinton and KC-SCI they have a first class day arranged for the kids. After breakfast, coffee and juice they have a safety first seminar followed by presenting each youngster with a turkey hunting vest full of calls, a decoy and even the shotshells to try to harvest their quarry with. From there the kids are broken into groups and sent to pattern their gun, shoot some clays, learn to use their new calls, experience a shoot/don't shoot walking course as well as making a couple of calls from house hold items. It was a great day for the youngsters and they could have sent them home after they gave them the vests happy as can be, but they stuck around and learned a lot. We all think we are the greatest teachers for our own children but something about a badge and uniform seems to get their attention as did the conservation agents that spoke to them.

You think it's fun pulling the trigger on an animal like that—try it with a kid that hasn't had that kind of opportunity before. You will see first hand the excitement that hunting has to offer.

Since my boys are both too old for the opportunity, I opted to bring my nephew, Conner. He had expressed interest in hunting over the last couple of years. He was grateful and so excited to show his mom and dad all his new found riches that he slept all the way home after a very busy day. The best part was when Johnny's neighbor and KC-SCI member and friend Jake Tonsfeldt invited us over for a tour of his ranch across the road from Johnny's. Jake opens his place up to ten young hunters during the spring season and gra-

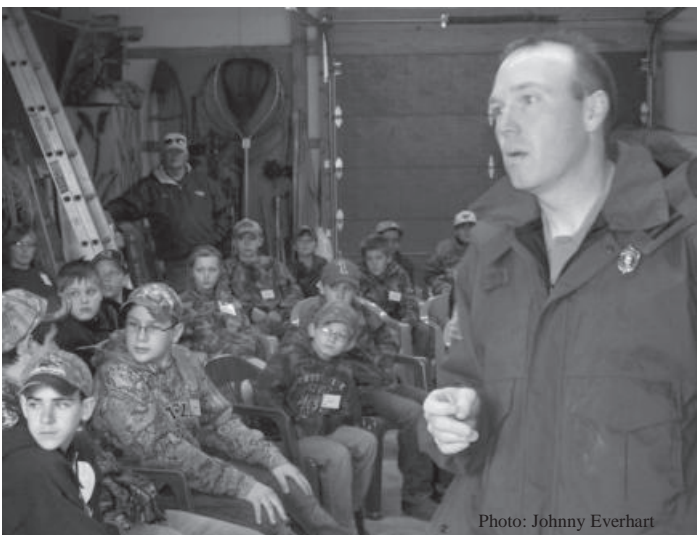

NEW MEXICO PRONGHORN WITH KIRK AND ROXANE KELSO

I booked a 2010 pronghorn antelope hunt with Kirk and Roxane Kelso after seeing one of their ads in the spring 2009 SCI Newsletter. They outfit for big whitetails out of their Rim Rock Ranch in Longton, KS. They also outfit pronghorn antelope hunts on private ranches in New Mexico. The New Mexico pronghorn season is 2 days long and it is usually on the second weekend of September.

I met Kirk, Roxane and their crew at a motel in Carrizozo, New Mexico on the day before the opener. When the rest of the hunters arrived, we went out to sight-in our rifles and meet our individual guides.

My guide and I parked the truck on opening morning and moved out in the dark. It was clear and cool, about 42°. As dawn broke we began to see "goats." I took my pronghorn at 11:30 a.m. It was 15 1/2" with good mass and shaped the way I like them. We processed it back at the ranch house and had it on ice by 1:30 p.m. The hunt went the way Kirk had predicted. I can really recommend it!

KETT'S DEER STORY

Here is the story behind the photo from the cover of our last newsletter. -ed.

2010 Rifle Season, Linn County, KS. This was the third morning of deer hunting during the 2010 rifle season. After a long, cold morning sitting in the stand, my dad and I decided that we should probably go home. This was my second season of deer hunting but I hadn't shot anything yet. I was kind of sad that we didn't even see anything this morning and I was wondering if I should have taken one of the smaller bucks we had seen the day before. As I started to unzip my jacket, my dad said, "maybe if we stalk in the woods we might see something." I shook my head "yes" and followed him back into the woods.

It was a very cold morning with a 20mph wind out of the north. Dad pointed to a brush pile at the top of a hill and said, "See him right there?" I looked all over but couldn't find him. Finally after several moments, I found the buck in the scope. He was only about thirty yards away and tending a doe. I took the safety off my gun. I pulled the trigger slowly. Click! The gun did not fire. Slowly, Dad took the gun away from me and reloaded it. Then he handed it back to me. The buck was still there. I put the gun back on my shoulder, but this time it took me a whole lot more time to find him. Finally, I found him again,

right in the same place he was when I first saw him. Steadily, I pulled the trigger. Click! The gun did not fire again. This time the deer heard me and stared at me for a solid five minutes. When he finally looked back, my dad took my gun away from me. Instead of reloading it, he handed me his Remington 300 SA/ Mag. I looked at him for a second almost saying "Really? You're going to let me fire this gun?" When he did not take the gun back I put it against my shoulder. Looking in the scope, I realized that the big buck wasn't in the same place as it was before. I looked around wondering, "Did he run off?"

Finally, with dad's help I found him again. Slowly, I pulled the trigger for the third time. Bang! I shot the gun. The deer, like the other two times, did not move. "Did I shoot him?" I tried to reload that huge gun but I couldn't. Looking back up, I saw that the deer was gone. We walked up the big hill and saw the body of that huge buck laying there. I shot my first buck, a ten pointer! SCI score 143 6/8"
